Are you an Honors student currently working on your thesis? Apply for a Robert K. Thomas scholarship!

Spring/Summer Deadline: March 15
Fall Semester Deadline: May 15
Winter Semester Deadline: October 30

Named after the founder of the BYU Honors Program, the Robert K. Thomas Scholarship (half-tuition) is awarded to committed BYU Honors students who

- 1. have completed at least 11.0 credits of required Honors coursework
- 2. have a minimum 3.5 cumulative grade-point average
- 3. have an approved Honors thesis proposal
- 4. demonstrate financial need, either through a completed a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form for the current academic year, or with a written explanation of financial need attached to application
- 5. will be enrolled for at least 2.0 credits spring/summer or 6.0 credits fall/winter.

Please do not apply if you do not meet the criteria described above.
