Application Deadline: December 12, 2021

Named for BYU Honors alumnus John Andrew West and Rebecca Donaldson West, this scholarship is made possible through their generous donation. It is a **half-tuition scholarship** awarded to students who are committed to completing Honors, who are early in their university career. Preference is given to first generation college students, and to students who have a relatively greater financial need.

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Be enrolled in or have completed HONRS 110, Introduction to the Honors Experience.
2. Complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) for the current academic year; international students should complete the financial need statement below.
3. Be enrolled for a minimum of 6.0 credits Winter semester.
