Application Deadline: July 31, 2023

This scholarship is made possible through a generous donation by the West Family. It is a **half-tuition scholarship** awarded to committed Honors students early in their university career. Preference is given to first generation college students, and to students who have a relatively greater financial need. Awards are typically for one semester.

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Be enrolled in or have completed HONRS 110, Introduction to the Honors Experience.
2. Complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid); International students should provide a financial need statement per the prompt below.
3. Be enrolled for a minimum of 6.0 credits during semester(s) of award.
